Mountain West Montessori School Re-Entry Rubric



Mountain West Montessori Academy has developed a particular set of protocols for operating during the re-entry phase of the Covid-19 pandemic. These protocols take into consideration the measures provided by the state's <u>Phased Guidelines for the General Public</u> <u>and Businesses to Maximize Public Health and Economic Reactivation</u>, including the recently released requirements and recommendations regarding school reopening, recommendations from the <u>CDC</u>, and standards of care advised by our state and local Health Departments, school Wellness committee, and school leaders within the Montessori community.

It is important to note that flexibility will be key in transitioning between precaution levels as the Governor and state Health Department may change the risk level fluidly to protect public health and safety according to the conditions of the pandemic in Utah, and we will follow the precautions outlined for each risk level according to the current color assigned to Salt Lake County. We note that circumstances may occur that could necessitate temporary dismissal for cleaning and contact tracing, and that events may need to be canceled or moved online in response to the situation.

Our primary concern is the safety and well-being of our students, families, faculty, and staff.
